ever, I know that is only a dream because haters will hate and you will never be able to please everyone. I will continue to hold my head up




and share my gifts and love with others. So, for those who smile in my face and stab me in my back at the same time I can only pray for you. This is my prayer:


I am so excited to get started on this journey and meet contestants, pro-

**Interview** is hard to prepare for because you just never know what questions the judges will be asking. Always remember to be honest. Don't tell them what you think they want to hear, answer the question honestly. This is a job interview. Make sure you handle it as you would a professional interview. The judges want to get to know you. Be yourself. I always try to make the judges laugh. That seemed to make me less nervous when I hear them laugh.

# Blurring the Lines with Bella

When I get the opportunity to judge, I find that I learn so much about each category and I want to share a few tips and guidelines with you ladies who will be competing for Miss Diva USofA this year.

**Interview:** Treat this category like a job interview. Make sure you dress to impress! I love to show my personality through my clothes and accessories, but make sure it isn't distracting. Your hair should compliment the outfit as well as your shoes. Make sure your hair is clean and doesn't have "fly aways". I am

a big fan of wearing my own hair up and away from my face therefore the judges can read my expressions. When you come into the room, make sure you greet each individual judge with kindness and respect. Remember, the title you are vying for is more than just looking pretty and performing, it's about making vital connections and showing the panel just what it is that you can bring to the role of titleholder as both an administrator as well as showcasing your unique personality. The way I think of it is: Who would I want to be stuck with on the side of the road with a flat tire in the middle of the night? Interview should reflect

you as both your own self and your drag persona, so let your light shine!

**Creative Evening Wear:** This category should be reflective of your style and taste, kicked up to the next level. Think Met Gala, the Oscars, and the Emmys. Outfits should still be functional but creative, always with excellent crafting and clean lines. Your modeling music will also be to your choosing, so make sure it reflects your look as well. I like to think of my evening wear as a total package from head to toe, from the tip of my wig topper down to the soles of my heels.

**Talent:** Make sure you ALWAYS have extra copies of your CDs. Even though everyone has the best intentions, CDs are easily scratched or systems can have trouble at the last minute, so bring backups to your backups. In my opinion, the best talents tell a story and are reflective of YOU and your best talent. If dancing isn't your thing, but something else is, please by all means DO IT! There is no right or wrong talent, as long as it is your best! Never try to do something you aren't comfortable with doing just because "everyone else is doing it." Build in a cushion of time, since there is a strict time limit. So make sure you don't lose any points by not paying attention to how long you will be out on that stage.

**Presentation of Theme:** This category is not judged but it is the first opportunity for the audience at the pageant to see you! This is your chance to really take risks and have a great time with the theme. This is your time to win people over to cheer for you and to give you that extra little push you might need to make it to the top. Have fun with it!

These are just my opinions of course, but please make sure that no matter what you do, do the obvious. Check for loose strings, stones, poor fit and flyaway wigs. When you get the little details right, it allows for more success within your categories. The USofA system is about consistency and detail, so just take the time to make everything super clean. You will thank me in the long run!

As I go into my first preliminary in Iowa, I want to say that I am so delighted to be your reigning Diva USofA. It is my honor and pleasure to represent Divas in the community. I am here for everyone, from the seasoned performer to the new girls setting foot on stage for the very first time. I include my contact information at the bottom of every article. Please do not hesitate to contact me for anything. That's my job to help you and my absolute pleasure to do so! I look forward to meeting you all on the road! As always -Dare to DIVA
